

The Counties






Outdoor Adventure

Looking for an outdoor adventure? The Finger Lakes region is jam-packed with beautiful state parks, stunning waterfalls, top-notch hiking trails, and other funfilled surprises! Whether you're seeking a family-friendly outing or an activity to get your adrenaline pumping, the Finger Lakes has something for you.

- 1. Bristol Mountain Bristol Mountain is the highest vertical rise between the Adirondacks and the Rocky Mountains! It also boasts breathtaking views for skiers and snowboarders of all levels as well as state-of-the-art snowmaking. Enjoy Bristol Mountain Aerial Adventure Park in the summer, with challenges, rope walks, and bridges, and even a children's course. For an exhilarating ride through the woods, try the 5,000 foot zip line canopy tour! | bristolmountain.com
- 2. Carpenter Falls Tucked away along the southwest end of Skaneateles Lake, Carpenter Falls is a slice of exhilarating, protected wilderness. The 90-foot waterfall has carved its way through stone to take a powerful plunge down into the deep, round pool below. Around the waterfall is an elevated boardwalk and accessible viewing platform, allowing all visitors the opportunity to traverse through the forest to view this spectacular waterfall. | dec.ny.gov
- 3. Chimney Bluffs State Park Towering 150 feet above Lake Ontario in Huron, Chimney Bluffs offers the most dramatic landscape of the Lake Ontario Shore. These large clay drumlins, formed six to ten thousand years ago by a glacier, were then eroded by waves and weather to create a photographer's dream. Hiking the trails or walking the shoreline will leave you awestruck! Pack a picnic lunch and enjoy nature's beauty. | parks.ny.gov/parks/chimneybluffs
- 4. Cornell Lab of Ornithology and Sapsucker Woods Renowned worldwide, the Cornell Lab of Ornithology is for bird lovers everywhere. It features hands-on exhibits, cutting-edge media experiences, and exceptional art, fostering a profound connection with birds and biodiversity. The Lab of Ornithology's 425-acre Sapsucker Woods offers five miles of wooded trails resonating with birdsong that provides a perfect backdrop for a stroll in nature. | birds.cornell.edu/home/visit






6. Erie Canal – This historic waterway stretches across several parts of the Finger Lakes region. The canal once played an important role in commerce and the development of the United States. Now it's a hub for outdoor recreation, popular with bikers, hikers, and boaters. Outfitters along the way offer canoe, kayak, and even houseboat rentals! Explore charming small villages, scenic views and rich history along the Erie Canal. | eriecanalway.org




- 7. Fair Haven Beach State Park Fair Haven Beach State Park is one of the finest public lakefronts in the state, with high bluffs above sandy beaches, hilly woodlands, and breathtaking sunsets. The park features 1,500 feet of beautiful beachfront including a guarded swimming area. Campsites and cabins are nestled within the gently rolling woodlands, with plentiful fishing and boating opportunities in Lake Ontario and Little Sodus Bay. Winter activities include cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling, and ice fishing. | parks.ny.gov/parks/fairhavenbeach/maps.asp
- 8. Finger Lakes National Forest The only National Forest in New York and one of the only three in the Northeast, this wilderness area offers over 16,000 acres to explore. With miles of interconnecting trails, you'll find gorges, ravines, pastures, and woodland. Enjoy birding, wildlife watching and tent camping! Get maps and helpful information at the Hector Ranger Station, or start with the Burnt Hill Trail and Ravine Trail for easily accessible hikes and spectacular views. | dec.ny.gov
- 9. Glider Ride at Harris Hill Soaring Elmira is America's Soaring Capital and the views at Harris Hill are spectacular! Gliders are motorless planes that are towed into the air by a power plane before being released to soar silently among the clouds for an unforgettable experience. The National Soaring Museum, home to the world's largest sailplane collection (most of which are rare or one of a kind), is located right beside the runway. | harrishillsoaring.org/rides
- 10. Greek Peak Mountain Resort From slopes to spa, discover year-round excitement at Greek Peak Mountain Resort, the premier destination for unforgettable family fun. With 55 trails, six aerial lifts, and a beginner slope, it's the largest ski resort in Central New York. Dive into adventure with tubing, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing at the Nordic Center. Experience heart-pounding zip lines, aerial challenges, and a Mountain Coaster at the Outdoor Adventure Center. Relax in eco-friendly luxury at Hope Lake Lodge. | greekpeak.net
- 11. Green Lakes State Park You've got to see the exquisite blue color of Green Lakes yourself! These two glacial lakes are meromictic lakes, with no fall and spring mixing of surface and bottom waters, so they're an unusual and striking shade of blue. The park also features a lush forest, an 18-hole golf course, a large beach, athletic fields, snowshoeing in the winter, and 10 miles of trails for cross-country skiing and hiking. | parks. ny.gov/parks/greenlakes/details.aspx






- 12. Keuka Lake Being different can be spectacular! The only Finger Lake not shaped like a finger, Keuka (pronounced Q-KA) is one of the few Y-shaped lakes in the world. Spend the night at a lakeside inn. Rent everything from paddleboards to jet skis, kayaks to pontoon boats. Treat yourself to a delicious meal by the water. Fish for trout, bass, and even land-locked salmon. Enjoy a guided tour on the historic Pat II tour boat. | exploresteuben.com/experience-keuka-lake
- 13. Keuka Outlet Trail This seven-mile trail is built on the track bed of an old railroad following along the Keuka Outlet waterway, connecting Keuka and Seneca Lakes with two main waterfalls. The Keuka Outlet Trail is multi-use and open year-round between sunrise and sunset for hiking, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, bicycling, horseback riding, and dog-walking. | keukaoutlettrail.org
- 14. Letchworth State Park Letchworth is one of America's most majestic natural wonders and has been nicknamed "the Grand Canyon of the East." The Genesee River runs through the center of the park, carving out a vast canyon with sheer walls and lush forests. Open year-round, it's gorgeous in all seasons but is especially vibrant in autumn when the park transforms into a kaleidoscope of fall colors. parks.ny.gov/parks/letchworth
- 15. Montezuma Audubon Center Get involved in local conservation efforts and experience the wonder of the outdoors in Wayne County. The Center houses a large exhibit area and nature store. There are five types of habitats on 198 acres, two restored marshes, two-miles of trails, and an all-access observation platform. Canoes, kayaks and snowshoes are available to reach the heart of Montezuma's wetlands, forests and grasslands. You can also enjoy nature photography, cross-country skiing, fishing, picnicking, wildlife viewing, and hiking. ny.audubon.org/montezuma
- 16. Montezuma Wildlife Refuge Established in 1938 as a refuge and breeding ground for migratory birds and other wildlife, Montezuma is situated along one of the most active bird flight lanes in the Atlantic Flyway. Stop by in March to see swarms of snow geese and thousands of pintail ducks stopping to rest on their way home! The Montezuma Audubon Center also offers education on wildlife resources. fws.gov/refuge/montezuma






- 18. Seneca Lake Harbor Park Experience the waterfront of the deepest of all eleven Finger Lakes! Start with a walk on the fishing pier and breakwater, then enjoy breathtaking views at the Seneca Lake Pier Pavilion. This quaint scene includes the picturesque Marina, the Watkins Glen Harbor Hotel, and Seneca Harbor Restaurant, formerly the old train station. You can also check out the sights through a cruise with Captain Bill's! | explorewatkinsglen.com
- 19. Stony Brook State Park Stony Brook is a well-kept regional secret south of Dansville, NY. Historically, its deep gorge offered protection in winter for the Seneca Nation of Indians. Today, it's perfect for a refreshing swim in the stream-fed pool on a hot summer day. Wander the hilly forest trails, explore the rim, or hike through the gorge with its three dramatic waterfalls. With picnic areas, a playground, and over 80 campsites, immerse yourself in nature for a few days. parks.ny.gov/parks/stonybrook/details.aspx
- 20. Tanglewood Nature Center & Museum This joint trail system unites 462 acres in Chemung County, including meadows, ponds, an abundance of wildlife, and breathtaking views. The seven hiking trails vary in terrain and difficulty, offering something for all hikers, including a sensory trail for children. The museum is home to over 40 animal ambassadors found locally and around the world, featuring mammals, birds, amphibians, reptiles, and arthropods. tanglewoodnaturecenter.com
- 21. Taughannock Falls State Park One of four stunning state parks in Tompkins County, Taughannock Falls State Park boasts the tallest single-drop waterfall east of the Rockies and offers picturesque waterfront access for swimming or boating on Cayuga Lake. When you pay for parking at Taughannock, you get the added bonus of access to other nearby state parks–Allen Treman State Marine Park, Buttermilk Falls and Robert Treman–to hike their trails and check out their waterfalls. | parks.ny.gov/parks/taughannockfalls
- 22. Watkins Glen State Park Watkins Glen often leaves visitors spellbound. Within two miles, the glen's stream descends 400 feet past 200-foot cliffs, generating 19 waterfalls along its course. The gorge trail winds over and under and through the spray of cascading waterfalls. Known for its natural beauty, the entrance to the Park is in the picturesque village of Watkins Glen located in Schuyler County. parks.ny.gov/parks/watkinsglen/maps



- 23. Canandaigua Lake Wine Trail Stretching from Victor to Naples, the Canandaigua Lake Wine Trail encompasses award-winning wineries and scenic views of vineyards and rolling hills. With its new mobile Wine Tasting Passport, you can enjoy complimentary tastings, discounts on purchased bottles, and more! | canandaigualakewinetrail.com
- 24. Cayuga Lake Wine Trail The first organized and longest-running wine trail in America, the Cayuga Lake Wine Trail includes fourteen wineries, a cidery, four distilleries, and a meadery. Cayuga's growing season is about three weeks longer than other Finger Lakes, with a unique microclimate in autumn that results in some truly special wines that are well worth exploring. - 25. Genesee Brewery The oldest brewery in New York State is now one of the most popular breweries and attractions in the region. Visit the Genesee Brew House, explore an interpretive center, gift shop, and pilot brewery on the first floor of the building, a restaurant on the second, and sweeping views of Rochester's High Falls from the Brew House's rooftop, geneseebeer.com
- 26. Keuka Lake Wine Trail These six member wineries craft some of the world's most beautifully balanced and vibrant wines and offer warm hospitality. Established in 1985, traverse the wine trail to taste outstanding wines, receive excellent hospitality, and enjoy breathtaking views around Keuka Lake. | keukawinetrail.com
- 27. Lake Ontario Wine Trail The Lake Ontario Wine Trail runs the expanse of the southern side of our Great Lake and includes five wineries, two cideries, and a distillery. The soil and climate along the shores of Lake Ontario produce excellent fruit, making every sip of their handcrafted wines, ciders, and spirits uniquely delectable. The Digital Tasting Passport allows you to enjoy year-round special offers and events! lakeontariowinetrail.com

- 28. LivCo Libation Loop Livingston County craft breweries, local cideries, distilleries, and renowned wineries have come together as the LivCo Libation Loop. This county-wide trail allows locals and visitors alike to taste many types of alcohol and explore multiple towns. The local soils, water, and weather give beverages made here a distinctive taste that can't be duplicated. - 30. ROC / FLX Craft Beverage Trail Beer, ciders, and brews from east to west! This beverage trail traverses through Monroe County, Ontario County, and parts of Wayne and Livingston Counties, so you can try a variety of Finger Lakes flavors. The Passport provides a map to over 30 wineries, breweries, cideries, and distilleries, as well as access to discounts on your tasting journey through the region.
- 31. Seneca Lake Wine Trail With a rich history of grape growing, Seneca Lake is home to excellent wineries. Tour the oldest post-Prohibition winery, Glenora Wine Cellars on the west shore, to the second-oldest, Wagner, on the east shore. This wine trail is one of the largest in North America and features a diversity of wine and many different styles of tasting rooms. senecalakewine.com

Arts & Culture

Fans of live music, art aficionados, and museum lovers alike will find amazing gems to explore on their next trip to the Finger Lakes. Learn about regional and national history, take in unique art, and even get some hands-on experience making your own creations.

- 32. Ake Gallery Located in the historic Crescent Commons in Cortland, Ake Gallery is a vibrant hub for affordable fine art in CNY. Helmed by local artist Paul Kozlowski, renowned for his cult following among Hollywood elites, the Gallery showcases his original masterpieces alongside works from local talents. Ake also hosts live music, open mics, and comedy nights, including the annual "Duck and Red Octopus Short Funny Stop Action and Animated Film Festival" each fall. | paulkozlowski.com
- 33. Arnot Art Museum A true hidden gem, the Arnot Art Museum has earned a worldwide reputation in its 100+ year history, and was named by Vitality Magazine as "arguably the best small-town art museum in America." Among the museum's permanent collection is a Picture Gallery with 16th-19th century European masterpieces and a group of important American Hudson River School paintings. arnotartmuseum.org
- 34. Cayuga Museum of History & Art Across its three different buildings, the Cayuga Museum promotes the appreciation of history and the arts. In the Willard-Case Mansion, guests can enjoy rotating and permanent displays of local art and history. Visit the Case Research Lab to browse an exhibit on the workings of Theodore Case's 20th century laboratory, the birthplace of sound on film. At the Carriage House Theater, explore a renovated 1850s carriage house which now operates as a multi-arts space. cayugamuseum.org
- **35.** Corning Museum of Glass Marvelous! Mind-boggling! Glass is a material humans have shaped for thousands of years for functional uses as well as art. If you've caught Blown Away on Netflix, you've seen how talented the artists can be. But, let's face it, the real star is the glass. Visit the world's largest glass museum. Watch live demonstrations. - **36.** Cortland Repertory Theatre Cortland Repertory Theatre is one of the longest running live professional theaters in the country. During the summer, CRT presents musicals, comedies, and children's productions at the historic Little York Pavilion on picturesque Little York Lake. During the winter, "CRT Downtown" showcases concerts, stage shows, and special events. - 37. George Eastman Museum Located in Rochester on the estate of George Eastman, the Eastman Museum is the world's oldest photography museum and one of the oldest film archives. The museum holds unparalleled collections in photography, cinema, and photographic and cinematographic technology, and photographically illustrated books. Browse exhibitions on photography and cinema, discover Eastman's life and legacy, and explore historic gardens, all set in Eastman's National Historic Landmark Home. eastman.org
- 38. Inspirations Trail The Livingston County Inspirations Trail is a 90-mile, self-guided route exploring the art of LivCo. Travel from downtown villages to stunning countryside views-this is a trail of inspiration you won't want to miss! From large-scale murals on buildings to sculptures and storefront displays (including fairies!)— we challenge you to find them all in the heart of the Genesee River Valley. - 39. The Rockwell Museum Upstate New York's only Smithsonian Affiliate, The Rockwell Museum boasts a world-class collection of Western and contemporary Native American Art and other exhibits focusing on "Art About America" as it explores the people, land, and ideas that have shaped our country. - 40. Saunders Finger Lakes Museum Dedicated to developing, supporting, and inspiring stewardship of the Finger Lakes Region, this museum showcases the cultural heritage and ecological evolution of the vast region. Family-Friendly Finger Lakes

Kids are more than welcome in the Finger Lakes Region! Kids of all ages will love exploring a 6-story treehouse, playing rounds of mini-golf, visiting a butterfly garden, and so much more. You can even catch a brass ring on one of the fastest traditional carousels in the U.S.!

- 41. Eldridge Park This Victorian-themed amusement park dates back to the 1860s! There's something for everyone, including dragon boat rides, walking/biking paths, a dog park, picnic areas, a mini golf course surrounded by a mini train, a skate park, a disc golf course, a splashpad, flying scooters, pony carts, kiddy rides, and a Tilt-a-whirl. Don't miss the fastest traditional carousel in the U.S., one of only 20 remaining where you can still catch a brass ring! eldridgepark.org/new/
- 42. Minnehan's Restaurant and Fun Center Minnehan's is the place for family fun! A full–service family restaurant serving charbroiled Zweigles hot dogs, juicy burgers, fish fry, and more. They are also known for their seasonal ice cream stand and mini–golf. Minnehan's Fun Center includes outdoor kart racing, batting cages, soft play area for the littlest ones, and an arcade. Minnehan's is located on the north end of Conesus Lake, a perfect spot for a great meal or some family fun. | minnehansgokart.com
- 43. Museum of the Earth Museum of the Earth is renowned for its paleontological collections, featuring more than 2 million specimens, including fossils of plants, animals, and invertebrates, with a focus on the history of life on Earth. Favorite exhibits include skeletons of a North Atlantic Right Whale and the Hyde Park Mastodon. The affiliated Cayuga Nature Center has miles of trails, a 6-story tree house, and can be accessed by foot or bicycle via the Black Diamond Trail. | museumoftheearth.org



- 44. RMSC Museum & Science Center Experience the thrill of invention and innovation through hands-on exploration at the RMSC Museum & Science Center, by hitting the 15 miles of idyllic trails at the RMSC Cumming Nature Center, or discovering the wonders of our universe in the recently renovated RMSC Strasenburgh Planetarium. Visit Rochester's hub for lifelong science learning to engage with the wonders of science and the natural world! | rmsc.org
- 45. The Strong National Museum of Play The Strong is the ultimate play destination for all ages! Experience two floors of hands-on, dynamic, interactive exhibit spaces. Explore the world's largest collection of toys, dolls, and games, play through video game history, and experience the charm of a 1918 carousel and an indoor butterfly garden. Discover the National Toy Hall of Fame, Toy Industry Hall of Fame, and World Video Game Hall of Fame, celebrating the history of play. museumofplay.org







History

History buffs, rejoice! The Finger Lakes are full of historic sites where you can dive into the lives of famous figures like Harriet Tubman, Mark Twain, and more. Explore world-class museums, learn about the engineering feat that is the Erie Canal, tour lighthouses and mansions—and that's just the tip of the iceberg!

- 46. 1890 House Museum Step into the past at the 1890 House Museum, originally home to industrial pioneer Chester F. Wickwire. Marvel at the legacy of invention and philanthropy as you explore Cortland's very own castle. Delve into the lives of the Wickwire family, their servants, and factory workers through the extensive collection. The museum offers diverse programs and exhibitions for the whole family, including thrilling paranormal investigations. | the1890house.org
- 47. Erie Canal Museum An engineering marvel, the Erie Canal cut through 363 miles of inland wilderness from Albany to Buffalo, connecting New York City to the Great Lakes and any port in the world. The museum is in the national Register 1850 Syracuse Weighlock Building—the only remaining canal boat weigh station in America. Explore the history of the Erie Canal, climb aboard a replica canal boat, stroll the Lock tender's Garden, and discover what makes Syracuse unique. | eriecanalmuseum.org
- **48. Ganondagan State Historic Site** Ganondagan is the site of one of the largest recorded settlements of thriving Iroquois culture. Today, the Seneca Art and Culture Center tells the history of the Seneca and Haudenosaunee through exhibits and artifacts spanning centuries. The replica Bark Longhouse and ethnobotanical trails are yours to explore. Attending a special event here completes the Ganondagan experience. ganondagan.org
- 49. Genesee Country Village & Museum History comes alive at the largest living history museum in New York. Step back in time with costumed interpreters to explore the 19th-century Historic Village, including the working brewery, blacksmith, pottery, tin shop, and baby animals. GCV&M is also home to an art gallery, nature center, and Baseball Park. Open seasonally with special events all year long, you'll find it in Mumford, 20 miles southwest of Rochester. | gcv.org



- 50. Glenn H. Curtiss Museum Before becoming an aviation pioneer, Glenn Curtiss was an accomplished bicycle racer and one of America's earliest motorcycle manufacturers. Driven by an insatiable need for speed, he held numerous speed records and became the "Fastest Man on Earth" in 1907 when he strapped a motor made for flight onto an altered bicycle frame. With popular events, exhibits of vintage aircrafts, motorcycles, and automobiles, the Museum tells the story of how Hammondsport got its wings. glennhcurtissmuseum.org
- 51. Harriet Tubman's Chosen Hometown Many people know Harriet Tubman as a conductor of the Underground Railroad, but few know the rest of her story. That story is Auburn, NY, where she spent 50+ years of her life as a free woman, owning property, becoming a business owner, and fulfilling her philanthropic work. It's where her legacy lives on. Learn more at the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park. the NYS Equal Rights Heritage Center, and the Seward House Museum. | equalrightsheritage.com


